Subject: Escalating Threat to Regional Peace and Security Following Military Aggression Against Iranian Territory

Your Excellency,

With utmost respect,

At a time when the world more than ever needs to strengthen multilateral order, constructive cooperation, and trust among nations, the recent military action by the Israeli regime in directly attacking the territory of the Islamic Republic of Iran constitutes not only a flagrant violation of the United Nations Charter but also a profound blow to the foundations of peace, sustainable development, and human security in the region.

The United Nations was founded in the aftermath of the atrocities of World War II to "save succeeding generations from the scourge of war." Yet today, a generation of Iranian entrepreneurs, workers, families, and children lives under the shadow of the very threat from which they were meant to be protected. An attack of this nature will not go unanswered — not in the memory of the people, nor in the annals of regional history.

We, as the Iran National Entrepreneurship Organization, representing millions of productive and committed individuals dedicated to reconstruction and development, strongly warn that the continuation of such unilateral actions by military powers threatens not only Iran's physical security but also undermines the legitimacy and credibility of international institutions.

We respectfully urge Your Excellency and the United Nations to:

Formally condemn this blatant violation of Iran's sovereignty;

Convene an emergency session of the Security Council to examine the implications of this act on regional peace and stability;
